

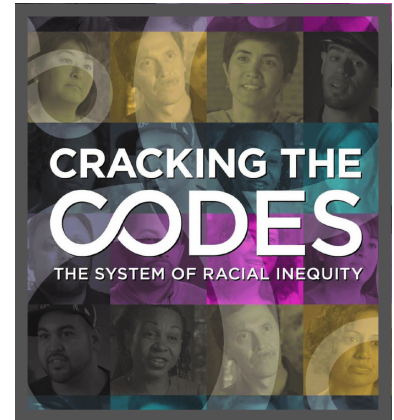

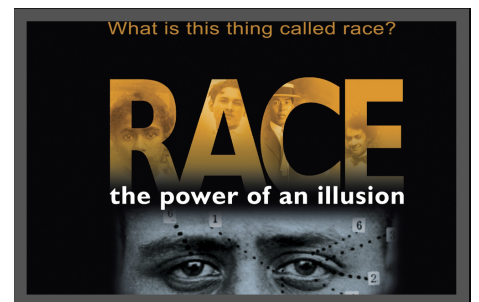
CRACKING THE CODES: THE SYSTEM OF RACIAL INEQUITY

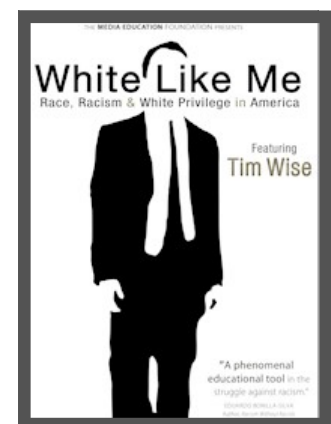
RACE: THE POWER OF AN ILLUSION

EMERGENT STRATEGY ADRIENNE MAREE BROWN
