Want to share work that has been completed or will soon be? Consider applying for:

Concurrent Session. Informative, 60-minute session that often includes a panel of presenters representing varying perspectives and opportunities for Q&A or other forms of audience interaction.

Poster. Graphic presentation of research or program results to be placed on an 8' x 4' tall board alongside other accepted posters, and/or an accessible electronic version in a virtual room.

Want to get feedback from diverse maternal and child health professionals on ideas you have for a thesis, dissertation, or other project you will be planning or working on in 2021?

NEW! Roundtable. Five-minute presentations about a topic you would like to explore in more depth, including any questions for which you are seeking guidance. There will be time for presenters and audience members to dialogue about considerations, resources to tap into, and potential connections with others engaged in similar/complementary efforts.

Note: The 2021 AMCHP annual conference is currently being planned as a hybrid in-person/virtual event. A final determination about the safety and feasibility of an in-person component will be made no later than early February 2021. All proposal authors and registered attendees will receive a communication at that time.
