About the Virtual Title V Partnership meeting series: This meeting series supports the Title V MCH Services Block Grant Program. Although we are not able to convene in person, we will come together virtually for four 90-minute sessions over four months to learn about topics of importance to your work to support the health of women, infants, children and youth including those with special health care needs, and families. The sessions will address implementation of Title V programs in the context of COVID-19, the Guiding Principles of evidence-based, family and youth-engaged practice, equity and social justice frameworks, and leveraging the new Blueprint for CYSHCN and the HHS Maternal Health Plan.

Who should attend: The Title V MCH and CYSHCN directors should attend. Other state Title V staff including, but not limited to, family leaders, youth leaders, MCH epidemiologists, SSDI coordinators, Title V program staff, and adolescent health coordinators, are welcome to join.

This session will help participants to generate new ideas about how to support populations across the Title V domains.</p> <p>AMCHP will share information about what has been learned from town halls and CARES telehealth implementation on MCH and CYSHCN program implementation from a national perspective. Do IAAs need to be updated in light of COVID? • Well-child visits, immunizations? • What policies has COVID made possible? What should continue? AMCHP will invite family and youth who are engaged with Title V programs to share their perspectives.</p> <p>Following the presentation, participants will go to one of six breakout groups to discuss how family and youth engagement and partnership are incorporated into their state action plan. Discussions should incorporate both MCH and CYSHCN program areas, including successes and challenges they anticipate over the next five years. The speaker will share a few examples with the large group, then move to breakouts. MCHB Speaker from the Division of Services for Special Health Care Needs will open the session to share the Blueprint.</p> <p>Participants will go to one of six breakout groups to discuss the blueprint and/or the maternal health initiative, and their potential impacts on Title V state action plan implementation.
