
Maternal and Child Health Block Grant 2023

The Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant, Title V of the Social Security Act, is the only federal program devoted to improving the health of all women, children, and families. In Fiscal Year 2021, 92% of all pregnant women, 98% of infants, and 58% of children nationwide benefitted from a Title V-supported service. To learn more about Title V, visit www.amchp.org.

State spotlight: Children with Special Health Care Needs

The Children with Special Health Care Needs (CSHCN) Program of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) Maternal, Infant, Child, and Adolescent Health (MICAH) unit supports screenings and early identification activities to identify children with special healthcare needs and ensure that they are connected to services and a medical home. This effort is done in collaboration with partners such as the hospital nursery, NICU, children's clinic, Early Intervention program, and the various MICAH programs that also serve children and families.

Outreach and peer support are provided by community health workers and the Family Support Specialist, who are part of the CSHCN program team. Monthly learning sessions and other capacity building activities are available for parents of CSHCN to attend to improve access to information and to improve partnerships between parents and medical providers and other CSHCN serving professionals, specifically organizations that are a part of the Disability Network Partners (DNP).

Current Special Projects of Regional and National Significance (SPRANS)

Special Projects of Regional and National Significance (SPRANS) funding complements the formula funding each state receives and helps ensure the success of state Title V, Medicaid, and CHIP programs by driving innovation, responding to emerging and entrenched issues, and building capacity for integrated systems of care for women, children, and families.
