**Application Summary**

AMCHP is requesting applications for 15 interns to participate in the Summer 2024 GSEP cohort. During the internship, interns will onboard and coordinate with the host site supervisor, conduct quantitative and qualitative data analysis as needed, learn about maternal and child health populations and programs, and attend weekly enrichment sessions on carefully selected maternal and child health epidemiology topics. The products resulting from the GSEP internship will serve both the host site’s data and/or programmatic needs and as additions to the intern’s suite of quality deliverables.

*What are we looking for in a GSEP intern?*

- ✓ Currently or recently enrolled graduate students with a strong, demonstrated interest in epidemiology, and maternal and child health (inclusive of youth with special health care needs), and health equity.
- ✓ Graduate students who have completed at least one (1) year of coursework prior to the start of the internship in June.
- ✓ U.S citizens, non-citizen nationals, or U.S. Permanent Residents as defined by the [U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services website](#).
- ✓ Ability to commit to 40 hours per week of work for the duration of the internship, which is 100% virtual with an optional host site visit in the first month.

It matches current and recent former graduate students with jurisdictional health departments and community-based organizations for practical, equity centered Maternal and Child Health (MCH) epidemiology experiences. Interns spend ten (10) weeks during the summer completing a significant data analysis, needs assessment, or program evaluation, or project with their host site. They also participate in a robust enrichment curriculum that includes weekly learning sessions, group processing spaces, and opportunities to network with leaders in the field.</p>

### Intern Expectations

It is expected that the intern will contribute 40 hours per week (broken down by activity below) for 10 weeks from June 3, 2024 to August 9, 2024. It is also expected that interns will attend an orientation session with their matched supervisor, complete all deliverables in a timely manner, and actively participate in **all** mandatory AMCHP-led enrichment activities. All interns will receive a total stipend of \$9,300, disbursed over three (3) points in a predetermined schedule.

<b>Small Peer Groups</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Attend weekly one-hour peer-sharing and learning sessions with a small subset of cohort members.</li> </ul>	1
<b>Other Enrichment Activities</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Attend office hours with maternal and child health epidemiology leaders as desired.</li> <li>• Complete asynchronous readings, videos, podcasts, and other media that support the respective week's theme as outlined in the curriculum.</li> </ul>	2
