What data do you have this time that you did not have for your 2020 needs assessment?

- North Dakota data for 2020:
 - Primarily collected data in-house
 - Developed "Work as One" team of stakeholders
- North Dakota data for 2025:
 - Contracting with NDSU to collect data via surveys, focus groups, key informant interviews
 - Collaborating with state partners to dovetail off State Health Assessment and the State Health Improvement Plan
 - Contract with the University of Tennessee to analyze SDoH data from BCBS of ND
 - Including MCH questions on other surveys (e.g., PRAMS, BRFSS, PRAMS for dads)



How are you continuing to engage stakeholders through the priority setting and action planning processes?

- North Dakota 2020 NA:
 - Convened "Work as One" team of stakeholders at two meetings
 - MCHB TA funds to help engage stakeholders
- North Dakota 2025 NA:
 - Seek out more stakeholders who work directly with the public
 - Develop centralized platform to share documents and continuously seek input
 - Include family perspectives (Family Advisory Council members)
 - Utilize current contract grantees
 - Contract with state universities
